

Message from Nathan

Promoting healthy swimming

Swimming is a great way to stay fit and active, and an important skill for life. As our school participates in swimming programs, it's important we all take steps to stop the spread of germs at the pool. This summer, the Victorian Department of Health advises there has been an increase in the number of people infected with cryptosporidiosis (crypto) – a type of gastroenteritis. Some people are attending pools while infectious, which spreads the infection to others.

To keep pools safe and clean for everyone, please follow these healthy swimming steps before we dive into the pool:

- · do not swim if you have diarrhoea
- · shower and wash with soap before swimming
- · wash your hands with soap after using the toilet
- · avoid swallowing pool water
- · change nappies in nappy-change areas only.

Please encourage your child to follow the above steps to support everyone's safety in pools. Please also keep your child absent from swimming lessons at school if they have had gastroenteritis or diarrhoea in the 14 days before the lesson. Families with any health concerns should see their doctor or contact NURSE-ON-CALL by phone: 1300 606 024 (available 24 hours).

5 tips to keep your family safe online



Parents and carers can use a combination of strategies to help young people build their digital technology skills and have safer experiences online.

1. Start the chat

Get into the habit of talking about online safety as a family, so your child feels comfortable coming to you if they ever need help working out an issue. It's never too early to introduce good online habits such as respect, empathy, critical thinking, responsible behaviour and resilience. As your child grows older, eSafety's advice about hard to have conversations will help with some of the tricky topics like sending nudes, online pornography and contact from sexual predators.

2. Create a family technology agreement

Creating a Family Technology Agreement can help you and your kids decide together when and how digital technology will be used at home. As a family, brainstorm easy-to-follow rules and display them where everyone will see them. Your agreement could cover things like: time limits, apps your kids are allowed to use and online behaviour. Families with younger children can download a template to guide the conversation.

3. Set up parental controls

Parental controls let you monitor and limit what your child sees and does online. It's best to use them in combination with the other online safety strategies listed here. Taming the technology can help you understand your options. Grab a device and get started with our guides to setting up parental controls on devices and accounts or in social media, games and apps.


4. Choose games and other apps carefully

Use eSafety's App checklist for parents to think about the positives and negatives when your child asks to download a new game or other app. The checklist covers things like age ratings, managing privacy settings and reporting abuse in-app. You can also use The eSafety guide to check and set up safety features with your child.

Use digital technology together

Exploring or playing on devices or online with your child can be a positive experience that promotes learning and development. Ask questions, be curious and get involved. To learn more, read our blogpost How to encourage good screen practices for your child.





WOMIN DJEKA FESTIVAL 2024

MPPS is excited to be involved in the Womin Djeka Festival again this year. Our theme for 2024 is the story of Barraeemal the Emu. Our students have enjoyed exploring this Dreaming story shared by N'Arweet Carolyn Briggs, a Bunurong/Boon Wurrung elder who has been working closely with the staff and children of Balnarring Preschool. We have explored how the Bunurong/Boon Wurrung people looked to the constellations, seeing the dark spaces between the stars where Barraeemal the celestial emu is connected to the lifecycle of Barraeemal the terrestrial emu.

At Yarning Circle our Koorie Kids have prepared 4 pieces of marine ply, painting them black to show the night sky for each season. These boards will be taken to the Womin djeka Festival on Saturday 2nd March as an interactive display where visitors can add a star to the milky way using white paint. Barraeemal the Dark Emu will be shown in his various positions in the Milky Way as the seasons progress, linking with the lifecycle of the emu. If any parents or friends would like to help out with manning our display at any stage between 9-5pm on Saturday 2nd March please let Lee in Prep S know.

Once complete, our Dark Emus will be mounted on the school fence along Robertson Drive. Come along to the Festival and add your star to the Milky Way! From the MPPS RAP team


